



Household Hazardous Materials (HHM)

What are HHMs?

Household hazardous materials are products used in your home for cleaning, repairs, and maintenance. These products are safe when used as directed, however, excess must be disposed of properly. HHMs are toxic, corrosive, flammable or reactive and should be handled carefully. Look for signal words on the label such as: danger, caution, warning, poisonous, flammable, or keep away from children.
